Lots of exciting things are happening at AID!

- Main Street Lofts, a 24-unit Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) building in West Chicago, DuPage County is scheduling residents for move in. This building includes service space in order to expand access to mental health and employment services to western DuPage County residents.
- AID is breaking ground on our 16+ acre development in Elgin on State Street. This project was recently awarded Community Support funds from Congressman Krishnamoorthi in the federal omnibus bill in order to build a community mental health center on the site. Keep an eye on the construction over the next 15 months!
- We have added new Associate Vice-President positions at AID. These positions are part of the Executive Leadership Team and report to AID Vice-Presidents. This added leadership level enhances our ability to stabilize and grow all of our programs!
- Once again this year, the financial audit was submitted with an unmodified opinion, the resource development team has been incredibly successful in writing grant applications and our current service lines continue to grow.

With the support of AID staff, the love of his family and his own perseverance, Anthony manages his social anxiety with newly learned coping mechanisms, cognitive behavioral therapy and weekly counseling sessions to process everyday life challenges.

Anthony now spends a lot of time with friends and is more social. He uses new skills to empathize and connect with others. Anthony has been taking on more challenges for himself academically, and was named "Student of the Month" in October 2022. After graduating high school, Anthony plans to pursue a career as a paramedic and help others in his community.



Joseph was referred to AID through the Mental Health Court (MHC) program: an alternative to incarceration for defendants whose criminal behavior is linked to mental health or substance use disorders.

Through this program, Joseph has made significant life improvements. In therapy sessions, he is able to work through issues of anger and hostility. His newfound career has helped him get on track and become a person that wants to be part of society.

Agency Highlights

AID received a three-year accreditation by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF), an independent nonprofit organization focused on advancing the quality of services needed for the best possible results. CARF surveyors were very impressed with the caring and knowledgeable AID staff. They also pointed out many areas of strength within AID, including: data management; equity and inclusion work; leadership including our engaged board; beautiful homes in great neighborhoods; person-centered outlook and services; creativity during a pandemic; use of technology; community partnerships; STARS and CDS volunteers; very strong employment program; crisis intervention continuum; quality service from a diverse staff; surveyors overall were impressed with the organization.



Introduced the NewStart program which provides individualized, community-based re-entry services for adults with disabilities who are rejoining the community after a period of incarceration. NewStart assists individuals in successfully reintegrating back into their community, reducing recidivism (both short and long term), reduce homelessness, and help maintain housing and active community integration while reducing or eliminating further encounters with law enforcement.



Thanks in part to an Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity grant sponsored by Illinois State Representative Keith Wheeler, AID recently completely renovated the O'Shea Center training kitchen. This newly remodeled, commercial-grade kitchen helps AID advance a new initiative focused on nutrition and wellness. Clients have the opportunity to cook, learn about food safety/ handling, menu plan and meal prep. Anna Barnes, AID Lead Food Skills Trainer, helps clients increase self-sufficiency in their home kitchens and assists AID residential staff, who cook with and for clients, enhance their meal preparation skills. This program also provides hands on experience, training and job skills for clients interested in a career in the restaurant, cooking or food industry.



The AID McHenry Behavioral Health program developed a "Treatment Without Borders" program to provide parenting groups in person and virtually in both English and Spanish. This service incorporates case management, therapy and mentoring services for adults, children and families.
