# Committee Update

March was an exciting month for the Keeler Advocacy Committee!

We attended the "Let's Start a Self Advocacy" webinar with Krescene Beck and Adam Wiser of the Illinois Self Advocacy Alliance. During this webinar, clients and staff learned about some important components of an advocacy committee. Clients voted to incorporate some new aspects into our committee such as a group motto, group rules to be read at the start of every meeting, and bringing on additional client members. The KCAC is excited to welcome Carol and Jenny to our committee this month!

Additional projects included working with Keeler clients to write emails to their elected representatives asking them to defend Medicaid and awarding the first Bill Davis Sunshine Award in memory of our beloved Keeler client, Bill Davis.

We had our second round of monthly club meetings and introduced a new club: Volunteer Club lead by Valerie Smith.

In our monthly meeting, we planned for our first quarterly outing, got ready for our logo contest, talked about how we had advocated for ourselves and others this past month, learned about famous people with disabilities, and decorated a box for the food drive.

### Advocacy Corner

Our advocacy efforts for the past month have been focused on reaching out to our elected officials to ask them to vote against proposed cuts to Medicaid. Medicaid is a government program that many people with disabilities use to help pay for health services like doctor visits, hospital stays, medication, day programs, and residential



services. Cuts to Medicaid may cause fewer services to be available, and people may need to wait longer for medical care. Keeler clients wrote emails telling their elected officials how important Medicaid is to them, and how different their lives might look without this important funding. Client Emmy had this to say: "It would be hard to do the things I like if I had to pay more money for things like medication and going to the doctor. I would feel really sad and frustrated if I couldn't do things at my day program anymore. Help me save Medicaid!"

You can help save Medicaid by reaching out to your Senators and telling them how important Medicaid is to you. You can find the contact information for your senators by visiting www.elections.il.gov and using the "Find My Elected Officials" option.




